

How do you prepare for your BSc. or MSc. thesis oral presentation at the complex final exam?

INTRODUCTION

The aim of the final complex exam to ending your university study and earning your BSc. or MSc. degree.

Differing from the previously successfully taken rigorosum exam, this kind of exam consist of two main parts. In the first part, you have to defend your BSc or MSc. thesis in form of deliver a brief oral presentation for the Complex Final Exam Committee and aftermath answering their questions related to your presentation. The second part – make your choice among the oral exam issues, which will be different from the rigorosum exam questions - and elaborate it and answer the question – will take place exactly the same way as in the course of the previously passed rigorosum exam. In this context, please keep in mind the Practical Guideline for Rigorosum technical details.

This newer outline briefly summarize all of the practical knowledge, which can be necessary to deliver your BSc. or MSc. thesis defense presentation impressive, informative manner in high quality.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR YOUR BSc. or MSc. THESIS ORAL PRESENTATION

The maximum number of your presentation slide should be 10 pieces including „Thank you for your attention” as well, which is not allowed to be the additional 11th slide (this last slide is not mandatory or inevitable necessary),

- In the first slide, you have to indicate your name and the title of your BSc. (MSc.) thesis,
- On one slide has to be no more than six line. It means that the size of the letters should be large,
- You can enrich your slides with figures and diagrams as well not only with the text lines,
- Please try to refrain from animating the slides due to the strict time limit (you will not have enough time to press enter line by line),

- The background should be light, the letters dark, because projectors can only show this well,
- Don't read the text of the slides, but say additional, complementary information or summary about the main focal points, key messages of the slides,
- You don't have to tell us the whole dissertation story, you don't have to present the table of contents and you don't have to talk about the research methodology including secondary information, literary sources,
- Try to focus on your most relevant and important own research results, and at the same time to react for your peer reviewer's criticisms related to your BSc.,
- Your oral presentation time limit is 10 minutes including your speech and answering the Exam Committee's questions about your BSc, thesis,
- Let us stand in the exam classroom to turn to the Commission and 'explain' clearly to them the key parts of your dissertation,
- We recommend the use of Power Point, although the Prezi is very good, but often used to emerging technical problems with its application.

It is important that everybody dress appropriately for the occasion!
